

Highlights for 2013:



Description of Event | There are over 19 000 people living in the township of Vrygrond. During the December- January school break, there is no Holiday Programme run for the children in the area. As an organisation, Projects Abroad shows its commitment to the township by hosting a Holiday Programme for 50 to 100 children between the ages of 5 to 15 years old in Vrygrond. With the assistance of international volunteers, the children are part of an interactive programme that is divided into two sessions: morning and afternoon sessions. The morning session consists of different stations, with at least one volunteer overseeing each station. Each station needs to be appropriate for all children between the ages of 5 and 15 years old. After lunch (12pm to 12.30pm), the afternoon session will begin. Thursdays at the Holiday Programme are beach days.
